## Health & Safety of Healthcare Workers during COVID-19

COVID-19 has put an immense strain on local stockpiles of personal protective equipment (PPE) and the increase in demand is showing no signs of slowing down as the infection rates peak on a daily basis. In this week's bulletin, we place the microscope on the challenge faced by the medical profession during this pandemic. It's a global crisis and South African doctors' and nurses' lives are on the line. A total of 511 healthcare workers on the frontline of the pandemic have tested positive. Of those, 146 have recovered, 26 are hospitalised and two have lost their lives - prompting nursing union DENOSA to down tools and protest.


What pieces of personal protective equipment (PPE) is the government supposed to provide nurses and doctors in state clinics and hospitals according to regulations?

The state is obligated to provide a full complement of PPE including a mask, gloves, aprons, goggles, shoe covers and head covers.



Is it true that there's a shortage of PPE in all provinces of SA?

The Eastern Cape, KwaZulu-Natal, Northern Cape and Limpopo appear to be the hardest hit.



Are healthworkers planning to go on strike?

There have been threats of strikes but no action has been taken yet. Some of the demands from unions include the unavailability of transport for nurses, especially those working at night. They are also calling for a Risk Allowance to mitigate against the threat of infection.
