## LOCKDOWN, SELF-ISOLATION, SELF-QUARANTINE

### What is the difference?

A lockdown is an emergency protocol that requires South Africans to stay at home except for essential purposes while all non-essential travel is not allowed.

#### LOCKDOWN

Self quarantine is staying home and away from other people as much as possible after exposure or potential exposure to an infection.

#### SELF-QUARANTINE

Self isolation takes place when someone who is confirmed to have coronavirus separates themselves from other people.

# Rumours → Facts




Can the police arrest people who break the rules of the lockdown?

Yes. Breaking the rules is considered a crime. Anyone who breaks the rules may be fined or sent to prison for a period not exceeding six months.



Will the public have access to lawyers during the lockdown?

Yes. Lawyers are an essential service related to the functioning of the courts.



Where can I access legal services?

Legal Aid South Africa will continue to provide legal services. Existing clients of Legal Aid South Africa are requested to first call the legal advice line (0800110110) to determine how urgent their matter is and will be advised on the process that needs to be followed. The Legal Aid South Africa local office can also be contacted with a reference number to speak to a legal practitioner.
